We kicked off 2022 with a **Virtual Open Mic Night**. Authors Kathleen Kalb, Catherine Maiorisi, Mally Becker, Sarah Burr, Cathi Stoler, Nancy Good, Ursula Renee, Constance Meccarello, Peggy Katalinich, Nina Mansfield, Catherine Siemann, and Lori Robbins read from both published works, and works-in-progress. As always, this evening was a delightful mix of humor, suspense and intrigue.

At the end of January, we joined the San Diego chapter on Zoom for a **Bi-Coastal Anthology Presentation** to discuss the recent anthologies published by our chapters: *Crossing Borders*, edited by Lisa Brackmann and Matt Coyle, and *Justice for All: Murder New York Style*, edited by D.M. Barr and Joseph R.G. De Marco. The event included more than twenty authors who discussed their stories, and also the editors of both anthologies who gave insight into their editorial process.

Our February and March programs both dealt with Marketing. In Marketing Primer Part 1: Designing Ads and then Advertising them on Facebook we were joined by board member

Sarah E. Burr, who gave incredible tips on how to easily create eye-popping digital advertisements. After we learned how to design ads that would entice potential readers, historical novelist Finola Austin, who also happens to be a creative strategist at Meta (formerly Facebook), explained everything we needed to know about algorithms, and how to make our ads have the widest reach.

For Marketing Primer Part 2: Getting the Word Out, we were joined by librarian and editor Brian Kenny; librarian, editor and author of *How to Get Your Book Into Libraries*, Henrietta (Etta) Verma; and mystery author and co-host of the podcast *Wish I'd Known Then*, Sarah Rosett. This panel was filled with information to help authors get their books into the right hands.

April's Zoom panel featured: chapter member Kathleen Marple Kalb, author of the Ella Shane historical mystery series; Agatha and Anthony award winner Richie Narvaez; New York Times Best Selling Author, Susan Elia McNeil; and was moderated by board member and author of the highly regarded Jane Prescott Mystery series, Mariah Fredericks. Past, Present and Future: Pushing the Boundaries in Historical mysteries delved into numerous intriguing topics, like how many historical details to include in a historical mystery, and how an author's background might inform the stories they choose to tell.

In May, our chapter hosted its second annual **Queryfest.** We were joined by Terri Bischoff, Senior Acquisitions Editor, Crooked Lane Books, Michelle Richter, Senior Agent, Fuse Literary and Shawn Reilly Simmons, co-owner/publisher/editor at Level Best Books. After a brief panel that discussed querying dos and don'ts, members were sent to break out rooms to have their query letter evaluated by the panelists.

In June, we were finally able to meet up again for our annual party at Cowgirl! New and old members were able to reconnect over guacamole and margaritas! And finally, in July, we were able to host our first in-person **Summer Writing Workshop** in over two years. Former private investigator, *New York Times* notable author and acclaimed writing instructor David Corbett taught us how to "Build Plot from Character". The day-long workshop was filled with many entertaining anecdotes and practical wisdom for crafting fully-dimensional protagonists and villains.

A huge shout out to Dawn Barclay, Sarah Burr, and our programming committee, Mariah Fredericks, Jeanna Weart and Jacquetta Szathmari for organizing these events!
